




GRADE 5


Grade 5



Comparing and ordering fractions with like and unlike numerators and denominators. Students in grade 5 used fraction blocks to help compare and order different fractions.






















Grade 1/2






We had a lot of exciting things happening in March! Our class had the opportunity to participate in a fun puppet project with the Art Museum of Hamilton. We also had a great Winter Carnival, went ice fishing and participated in a FNMI themed literacy afternoon. Students have been working to increase their knowledge of letter-correspondences, such as consonants, vowels, digraphs, and blends and applying this knowledge when reading and writing words. The class continues to listen to a variety of fictional and informational texts that are read aloud to build their vocabulary and comprehension. In March, students in grade 1 continued to build their numeracy skills by practicing addition and subtraction within 20 and learning how to skip count by 2s, 5s and 10s. Grade 2 students completed a unit on measurement and learned how to measure and compare using non-standard and standard units. We are so happy that spring is finally here!

Grade 3/4

Happy Spring!

This month we had lots to celebrate! Grade 4s finished their graphing unit and now both the grade 3 and 4 students are working on multiplication. In English, students are expanding their writing by adding more details. They also finished their Charlotte's Web project. In science, students are beginning their hearing and sound unit by recording and manipulating their voices. In Social Studies, students are going back in time to the stories and histories of the people of Alberta. We had a fish filleting demo, went ice fishing and even got a few bites! Finally, students had the opportunity to build a model of a pencil holder on the computer and 3D print it!





















Grade 5

In grade 5 math we have been working on fractions identifying fractions, comparing sizes and finding equal fractions. In science we are continuing to work on our electricity unit testing materials to see if they are conductors or insulators. In health we are starting our budgeting unit deciding what is a need and what is a want. Grade 5 students are reading "The Tale of Despereaux" and are excited to hear about how our three characters (Mig, Despereaux, and Roscuro) met. In social, We are learning about how the Canadian Shield Region is made of ancient rock. Students went ice fishing for the day on March 14.

Grade 6

The spring weather is almost here! Students in Grade 6 have been enjoying listening to the Mars Patel podcast, learning about figurative language, and practicing adding suspense to their stories. In science we have been studying the stars, the Sun, and the seasons in our Sky Science unit. In Math we have been working on mixed numbers, improper fractions and decimal numbers to thousandths. In Social, we have started our Iroquois unit. Students have learned about and built a longhouse as well as completed a google slide project researching each of the nations who made up the Iroquois confederacy. We explored healthy eating in Health and students are enjoying playing lacrosse in PE.











Grade 7

In 7 ELA, the students are learning about elements of rising action and ways that animals communicate through a novel about Inuit Alaska. They have attempted soap carvings in the style of Inuit soap carvings. In 7 Social Studies, the students are learning about the history of the Metis and their important role in the development of Canada. We will listen to and analyze some of the songs of Pierre Falcon, an early Metis singer and composer. Our Grade 7s have been studying Heat and Temperature in Science, and in Math, they have been focusing on Area, Perimeter, and Circumference, and changing fractions into decimals. The grade 7s have also had the opportunity to do beading in the classroom.









Grade 8

In grade 8 ELA, the students are following a fail-proof method for writing a solid five paragraph essay. They are analyzing sample essays and how they are structured. Then they are writing on topics they are passionate about. In 8 Social Studies, the students are learning about the worldview of the Spanish and how it contributed to their devastating policies against the Aztec people. They will link this to our own past and Truth and Reconciliation. The Grade 8s have been busy exploring the fascinating world of Light and Optical Technology. They have been learning about how light behaves and the different ways it can be used in our daily lives. Additionally, they have been flexing their mathematical muscles by creating formulas in Math. This is an excellent way to practice critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Moreover, they have been delving into the world of algorithms and coding through the use of beading. This is an exciting way to learn about programming and its applications in our daily lives.





Native Language

We have been incorporating technology with our learning using Google Slideshow, Kahoot!, Blooket.

We have played new Cree adapted games focusing on language learning and revitalization of our language in our students.

Each student is creating their own Cree dictionary of the words that we are learning. The Cree Dictionary has the Cree term, the English translation and the syllabic spelling.

We focus on pronunciation and vocabulary, eliminating the use of worksheets.

We have a fantastic time in our Cree class!
