In the ECS classroom play is how our children learn about the world, themselves, and each other. It is part of a healthy development, it allows students to stretch their imaginations, create make-believe, and interact with their peers. The ECS students explore creative play and build skills in problem-solving, peer relationships, and creativity every day. We continue to develop our numeracy skills: working with quantities, basic addition, and numbers I to 20. Students are learning how to decode short vowel words, beginning reading development, and exploring the world around us using our 5 senses.





GRADE 1/2

It is hard to believe that June is already here and there is only one month left in the school year. It has been such a wonderful year in Grade 1/2! In May, students learned about facts and opinions and the difference between them. Students were provided with many opportunities over the month to express their opinions in writing. Students are working hard to build their writing stamina and to increase the amount that they write. Students continue to participate daily in various activities to increase their literacy skills. In Math, students in grade 1 continue to work on building their understanding of numbers to 100. Students also continue to examine and further develop their understanding of addition and subtraction within 20. Grade 2 students continue to investigate addition and subtraction within 100. In Science, we finished up our building unit. The students enjoyed designing and building different objects. The students created vehicles, animal houses and boats. It was amazing to see how the students experimented with different materials when designing and constructing their projects. I hope you all have a wonderful June!



GRADE 3/4







The grade 3 and 4 students have been working on fractions in math. Grade 4 students are expanding into decimals and grade 3s are working with money math. Students have started reading Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing as a novel study in English. They also enhanced their writing by using dictionaries to find interesting words, creating compound sentences, and fixing run-on sentences. In science, we have researched plants with special needs and looked at each plant part function. In social studies, students are expanding their Metis knowledge and the Metis role in Alberta's creation.










In math, we have been translating shapes, comparing 3D shapes and finding the perimeter of quadrilaterals. The students are enjoying their chemistry unit making solutions, suspensions and making cola ice cream floats to identify the three states of matter. The students enjoyed their Call the Electrician and Skydome experience with Telus world of Science. In Language arts, students finished our Tale of Despereaux novel, learned about similes and hyperboles, and have continued with their spelling units. In Social, we have finished all of our Regions of Canada and are now starting to learn about Confederation. In art we have worked virtually with the artist Nancy Benoy from Hamilton Art Gallery on more watercolor projects.

They're mastering calculations and exploring the space occupied by various shapes. At In science, they're equally thrilled as they learn about mechanical systems. From understanding components to how systems work, they uncover the mechanics that shape our world. 🖋 🔯 In Art the grade 8s have been working on the theme of the month: the turtle which represents truth and honesty. The students have produced some great examples of dot art. In ELA 8, the students are undertaking a film study and examining how visual and audio stories use many of the same elements that written narratives utilize. The students will compare the effectiveness of these techniques in order to create mood and theme in their own writing. In Social 8, the students are studying about Japan and why it remained isolated for so many years before opening up to rapid modernization. We apply learnings from this experience to Alberta and how calls for independence might play out for our province. Keep up the great work, everyone!
